Bullying/Cyberbulling- School Board Policy 249

According to the Southmoreland School District Policy 249: Bullying/Cyberbulling, bullying means an intentional electronic, written, verbal or physical act or series of acts directed at another student or students, which occurs in a school setting and/or outside a school setting that is severe, persistent or pervasive and has the effect of doing any of the following:

- 1. Substantial interference with a student's education
- 2. Creation of a threatening environment
- 3. Substantial disruption of the orderly operation of the school

Consequences for violating this policy may include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Counseling within the school
- 2. Mediation within the school
- 3. Parental conference
- 4. Loss of school privileges and exclusion from the school sponsored activities
- 5. Detention
- 6. Suspension
- 7. Citation to the District Magistrate
- 8. Alternative placement outside of school
- 9. Expulsion
- 10. Counseling/Therapy outside of school at parental expense
- 11. Referral to law enforcement officials
