








Food Service Department










Wall of Honor



In the fall of 2022, veterans in our learning community and district administration met to discuss how we might recognize our graduates who have chosen the path of service upon leaving our schools. These conversations led to the development of a vision and a plan to honor our veterans through the establishment of the Scottie Wall of Honor, which will be housed in our High School Student Union for our students and the community to visit.

Through the generosity of our Veterans for the Park group, our project began with a POW/MIA table, which is adorned with the required pieces. Details regarding the symbolic representations for those items may be found here.

The Scottie Wall of Honor was completed in November of 2023 by students from our high school and our <u>Central Westmoreland Career and Technology Center</u>.

A pallet wall is the base for six shadow boxes. Each box represents a branch of our armed forces (Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard and Space Force). For each of those boxes, the Veterans for the Park has graciously provided dog tags that honor our graduates and their branch of service. This wall is also the home to a piece of art designed by veteran Mr. David Mates.

On November 11, 2023, the Wall of Honor was unveiled at a ceremony that included local representatives, families and friends, and most especially, our veterans. Please <u>click here</u> to watch the ceremony. This <u>short clip</u> shows the completed wall.

Veterans, current service members and families of service members who would like to recognize a graduate who serves or has served in our military should complete the <u>Southmoreland Wall of Honor Nomination Form</u>. Upon verification of service, the Veterans for the Park will order the creation of the dog tag and then we will place it in the service box so that it may be seen by students and visitors alike. Our future plans include the establishment of an interactive collection of interviews from our veterans that will be collected by our students.

Kindergarten Registration will be open from **February 5th - April 12th.** All students must be registered online within this window to be included in our Kindergarten Screenings and Orientation.

Registrations will not be processed until all required documents are received.

Eligibility:

For a child to register for Kindergarten they must:

- Be five years of age by September 1st of the current school term
- Have a birth certificate
- Meet state immunization law requirements

Pumpkin Drop

On October 27, students from SES, SMS, and SHS traveled to WVU to participate in the annual pumpkin drop event. In preparing for the drop event, students learned about energy, gravity, acceleration, momentum, and other forces. They put their learning into action preparing their devices. Southmoreland entered 5 drop teams (1 elementary, 1 middle, and 3 high school). Of the 5 pumpkins dropped by SHS students, 3 survived the 10 story drop. The high school team made up of Faith Tarr and Nolan Blaze created a minimalist device that survived to 120 foot drop. The middle school team made up of Brandon Puskar, Laurel Cavalier, Will Byrd, and Jaycee Pire created a device that also effectively protected their pumpkin, and the elementary device designed and built by Will Cavalier and Gracie Ansell allowed their pumpkin to make the drop unscathed. After dropping, the students explored exhibits put on by various WVU engineering students.

There were high powered rockets, RC drones, offroad

vehicles, remote controlled rovers that looked like they belonged on Mars, compact race cars, and electric vehicles. The students all enjoyed hearing the college students describe the design and construction of the vehicles.
